What is Junior 4-H Camp?

Junior 4-H Camp is a 5 day residential 4-H camping experience for boys and girls ages 9-13. 4-H camping is cooperative group living in a natural environment, which focuses on the individual's social, spiritual, mental, and physical development.

The purpose of 4-H camping is to develop life skills using fun, educational programs and activities. The six (6) major life skills that are emphasized at Junior 4-H Camp are:

- Understanding Self
- Communicating and Relating to Others
- Acquiring, Analyzing, and Using Information
- Problem Solving and Decision Making
- Managing Resources
- Working with Others

4-H camping exposes youth to educational and recreational experiences in a wide variety of programmatic areas, including environmental education, aquatics, paddling, animal science, science and technology, outdoor adventure/leadership, and shooting education.



The W.E. Skelton 4-H Educational Conference Center is located on a 120-acre peninsula on Smith Mountain Lake in Franklin County, VA. Facilities include sleeping lodges with indoor shower and restroom facilities. In addition, an air-conditioned dining hall and auditorium/stage are used daily by campers. Participants have access to a variety of facilities including an Olympic-sized pool, ropes course, mini golf, archery and shooting ranges, computer, outdoor and cooking labs as well as recreation fields and lakebased classes like canoeing, kayaking and fishing. The center is a safe, educational space for youth to learn and grow. Medical staff are on duty at all times. Food prep staff are trained to prepare meals for special dietary requests. The Skelton 4-H Center is an ACA accredited camp facility.

Who can attend Camp?

Youth ages 9-13 as of Sept. 30, 2022. We camp with Augusta, Rockingham and Alleghany Counties

Camp Fee:

The total cost per camper is \$350 - fee covers lodging, meals and snacks, insurance, counselor & adult supervision, classes and materials, camp t-shirt and transportation to and from camp. Fee does not include souvenirs or props for Theme Nights and Talent Show.
