Keeping the Club Strong

Helpful Hints

- Get to know all 4-H curriculum possibilities for your project areas
- Conduct regular organizational and project meetings
- Establish good youth-adult partnerships
- Allow youth to make decisions
- Establish good communication network with club members and families
- Share information about current 4-H events and opportunities
- Involve club members in county, district, state, national and international 4-H activities
- Recognize achievement
- Build community relationships with other organizations
- Seek and receive support from 4-H staff, other 4-H leaders and alumni



What is 4-H? Who can Join?

4-H is a hands on, fun program of learning for all children between the ages of 5 and 19. It offers young people the opportunity to develop new interests, make new friends, practice decision-making skills, and develop leadership abilities. 4-H is the largest youth development organization in the United States. Adult volunteers give their time and talent to make 4-H clubs happen.

In Bath County, most 4-H'ers belong to in-school clubs with two primary officer positions. We would love to create more 4-H opportunity with community clubs where youth can learn to elect officers, conduct meetings, complete 4-H projects, plan programs and participate in community service and other activities.

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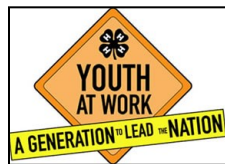
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Step 1

Getting Started

- Contact the Bath County 4-H office, 540-839-7261
- Tell us your interest in 4-H and your needs
- You will be invited to come to the 4-H office to talk about 4-H possibilities and the leader training process.
- Attend leader training (two 2 hour sessions with other interested adult volunteers and the 4-H agent and staff)



Step 2

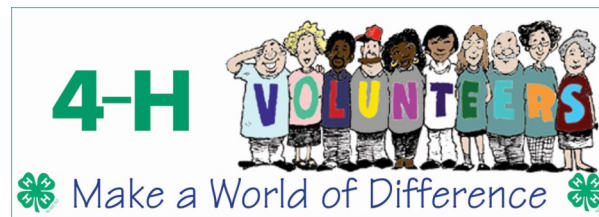
Tell the 4-H Story

- Tell families in your community about 4-H—you might hold an informational meeting with help from the 4-H staff.
- Tell the opportunities available through 4-H.
- Explain how a 4-H club operates.
- Use 4-H materials to educate. You can get these from the 4-H office.

Step 3

Create a Strong Support Base for Your 4-H Club

- Recruit adult volunteers and teens to help organize the 4-H Club
- Ask people directly to take specific jobs in the club
- Explain the roles of adult volunteers:
- Organizational Leaders
 - Assistant Leaders
 - Project Leaders
 - Activity Leaders
